<p>27 March</p>	<p><u>Nursing Home Staffing Campaign</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Department of Health and Human Services: CMS-2V2-26-001 • \$20 Million Award Ceiling: 15 Awards • Funds recruitment of RNs and LPNs/LVNs in nursing homes via financial incentives like loan repayment and stipends. • Up to \$40,000 per LPN. • Eligibility: small nonprofits, faith-based groups meeting criteria, national nursing associations, nursing organizations, and nursing student groups.

Nonprofit and for-profit appointed government agents.
<p>30 March</p>	<p><u>Second Chance Act Addressing the Needs of Incarcerated Parents and Their Minor Children</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Department of Justice: O-OJJDP-2025-172513 • \$750,000 Award ceiling: 5 Awards • Support incarcerated parents and their children. • Reduce antisocial behavior, decrease recidivism, promote responsible parenting. • Lower juvenile justice involvement and encourage healthy development. • Eligibility: County, City and Tribal Governments.
<p>30 March</p>	<p><u>Second Chance Act Youth Reentry Program</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Department of Justice: O-OJJDP-2025-172511 • \$750,000 Award Ceiling: 15 Awards • Deliver comprehensive reentry and transitional services for moderate- to high-risk youth. • Provide services before, during, and after release from confinement. • Eligibility: County, City and Tribal Governments. State Government Agencies. Nonprofits.
